THE BETHANY BLUEPRINT

ROMANS

"This epistle is really the chief part of the New Testament, and is truly the purest Gospel. It is worthy not only that every Christian should know it word for word, by heart, but also that he should occupy himself with it every day, as the daily bread of the soul. We can never read it or ponder over it too much; for the more we deal with it, the more precious it becomes and the better it tastes."

—Martin Luther (*Luther's Works* vol. 35:365)

"In this epistle we thus find most abundantly the things that a Christian ought to know, namely, what is law, gospel, sin, punishment, grace, faith, righteousness, Christ, God, good works, love, hope, and the cross; and also how we are to conduct ourselves toward everyone, be he righteous or sinner, strong or weak, friend or foe – and even toward our own selves."

—Martin Luther (*Luther's Works* v. 35:380)

The epistle of which Luther speaks is St. Paul's letter to the Romans. It was through teaching this portion of Scripture that the Spirit of God revealed and thus Martin Luther re-discovered, the truth of the grace of Christ. In this book the foundations of the **Reformation: Grace Alone, Faith Alone and Scripture Alone** are clearly found. It is also in this epistle that the "doctrine on which the church stands or falls," i.e., justification is from first chapter to last proclaimed in all its power.

St. Paul's letter to the Romans serves as the epistle reading this Pentecost season and will serve as our sermon texts from the end of June through early September.

Why not "occupy" your devotional time with it this summer and be ready for us to "deal with it" corporately in worship this summer at Bethany.

Community Impact Report...

"Times Change, Values Don't" is a Lakewood City motto "Times Change, God's Word Doesn't" is ours.

Times have changed significantly in regard to marriage. *The National Marriage Project* (U of VA) reports on the "state of our unions" and monitors the current health of marriage and families in America. Their entire report can be read online and give you further wisdom. (Search The National Marriage Project on the internet). The report begins by stating affluent families seem to be stable; the poor families continue to be fragile and weak, but the center/middle families' marriages are floundering.

In brief, (and they have much more to report) there is a shift in marriage mores, increases in unemployment, and decline in religious attendance causing the retreat from marriage. Not surprising to most of us as we experience marriages "floundering" with our friends and families and many close to us. Times are changing with marriages, aren't they?!

God's Word does not change, does it?! We are to "honor marriage as God's institution, the lifelong union of one man and one woman." (Luther's Small Catechism, which refers us to Gen. 2:24-25 and Mark 10:6-9) Are we being held captive to deceptive changes in marriage? What does Colossians 2:8 say to *you*: "See to it that no one takes you captive through hollow and deceptive philosophy, which depends on human tradition and the basic principles of this world *rather than on Christ.*"

Remember the Defense of Marriage Act (DOMA) that was passed in 1996 and signed by President Clinton? It excluded, on the federal level: health, Social Security, pension and tax benefits unless marriage is between one man and one woman. However, states can allow *marriage* between same-sex individuals. Some states have done this: Connecticut, Iowa, Massachusetts, New Hampshire, Vermont, as well as the District of Columbia. (This month New York may become the 6th state.) Many other states recognize *civil unions*. There are rumblings that DOMA will be threatened. Times are changing. Many more are leaning toward accepting same-sex marriage, especially between younger voters.

Remember Prop 8 in California? Passed in November 2008 by 61% of voters to make it a constitutional amendment that marriage is to be only between one man and one woman. This was 2.5 years ago! It has been in courts ever since with a ruling in August 2010 by a judge that ruled that the proposition amendment was unconstitutional and determined that same-sex couples do have a right to marry. Times are changing.

We are not to be taken captive through hollow and deceptive philosophy scripture says. God's Word does not change. Prepare yourself to give an answer to what God's Word says. In a recent sermon we were told "to be "aweigh"; to raise the anchor and leave the safer harbor of being with Jesus in person and go into the rougher waters of taking Jesus to people. What might that mean in regard to marriage and going into rougher waters? Perhaps....know about and then speak out on DOMA and any legislation that does not reflect God's Word that does not change; guide and mentor our youth to lead sexually pure and decent lives while praying that they are yoked with believers; come along the side of those having trouble with their marriage; spouses forgive and love each other. HE gives us wise guidelines in Scripture to help us avoid counterfeits so that we can live His abundant life, rather than ending up in brokenness and despair apart from Him and each other.

Happenings...

Many of you remember our friend Craig Huey, who has brought his Election Forum to Bethany three times since 2008, offering valuable guidance to help us vote our Christian values. In case you've not heard, Craig is running for the U.S. Congress in California's 36th District (South Bay and beach cities) in a special election on July 12. Craig was the second place finisher in a field of more than 10 candidates in an open primary election in May, and so will be in a runoff against L.A. City Councilwoman Janice Hahn. Ministry of Outreach News...

I have been a fan of the Lutheran Hour radio program for many years. I fondly remember listening with my dad in the car. Hearing the Gospel proclaimed in that format was always pretty neat for me, not to mention a great outreach tool. Recently the Lutheran Hour called a new pastor to be their voice. It just so happens that the new speaker was my seminary advisor. Pastor Gregory Seltz is one of my mentors and taught me a lot about being a pastor. At the end of each Lutheran Hour broadcast the speaker responds to questions and today I would like to share with you a portion of what was broadcast on May 15, 2011. I think his words are important for our 21st century ears to hear.

ANNOUNCER -Today we're talking about the Good Shepherd and what it means to have a Shepherd for our lives even today. There's a struggle for one of our listeners to understand just that point. He writes, "How can you share with modern people who Jesus is when we're using stories about Him as a Shepherd, something that most of us know absolutely nothing about? Shouldn't we then update the Bible stories a little?" Shouldn't we find a better way to speak about Jesus?

SELTZ - I'm not sure that searching for better ways is the motivation for the answer to our question, though. The Bible is a book that conveys the righteousness, holiness and gracious love of God in various ways and sometimes, in very literal ways, ways that we're to hold on to and to follow. But, even in those instances, we translate those words into words that we can understand.

ANNOUNCER: So in the case of our lesson today, Jesus, as the Shepherd, that's kind of a metaphor, one that might have spoken more clearly to agricultural people way back when, not so much today.

SELTZ: Well, yes. We don't have much experience with shepherds today, so there is a tendency for us to look for other examples, other ways of explaining that "Jesus (like a Shepherd) protects us, Jesus knows us by name, Jesus is a Savior who knows our weaknesses, knows our fears and came to save us," just like a Good Shepherd.

ANNOUNCER: OK. But I hear another side coming up as well.

SELTZ: Well, not so much a no, but a caution AGAINST SAYING that those first-century metaphors can't speak to 21st century folks like us.

ANNOUNCER - And what do you mean by that?

SELTZ - Well, shepherds, like farmers, were people who lived close to the land, to the dust and there is something about dealing with those things so close to the basics of life that even 21st century folks can understand.

ANNOUNCER: So, then it's not that His words can't speak clearly to us, but we might have to, maybe, work that word a bit more in order to hear it for ourselves?

SELTZ - Yeah, I would say so. That's good. We might have to do a little reading about what it means to be a sheep in a Shepherd's pen. We might have to do some study about what it is that good shepherds do that bad ones don't. While it might be foreign to us, I think those basic things about God, faith, love, courage, those kind of things, they come through pretty clearly in that phrase, "Jesus Christ is the Good Shepherd"

ANNOUNCER: So there is always the pressure, I guess, to take God's word and speak it in words that we can clearly understand.

SELTZ: I think that's exactly what God has done, when He came among us. He breathed our air, He ate our food, He walked our roads, and He communicated His message in words that we can understand.

ANNOUNCER: So, then, don't be too quick to start looking for other images, other metaphors, when what the Bible has to say still speaks clearly or can speak clearly to us even today, right?

SELTZ - Absolutely. Maybe it's best to say it this way....In all things we are called to be faithful to God's Word as we seek to share His words in words that people can understand today. You know what's amazing? God's Word can actually do that with our words.

ANNOUNCER: I'm glad that Christ can speak His Good News to you and me in words that we can understand. Thank you, Pastor Seltz.

MISSION STATEMENT: Bethany Lutheran Preschool exists, "To provide quality Christian early childhood education in a safe, loving and caring atmosphere; daily teaching God's forgiveness and love through our Savior, Jesus Christ."

The staff of Bethany Lutheran Preschool is excited to welcome Bobbette Lofton to our staff as our newest teacher! Bobbette, of course, has been serving in Bethany's day school for the past twelve years. She taught both Kindergarten and First Grade; and will serve as our Pre-K/Transitional K teacher. With her experience in the early elementary grades, Bobbette will enable Bethany to do an even better job of transitioning children between preschool and kindergarten. Bobbette will spend her summer moving her classroom into the preschool area; and will join us full-time when our end-of-summer work week begins.

Speaking of our end-of-summer work week...if you just can't get enough of scrubbing toys, cots and small chairs, we would like to invite you to join us for our SCRUB day which is scheduled for Monday, August 22. We start at "early-dark-thirty" (around 6:00 am) so that we can get a lot done before it gets too hot. It has typically been cool and overcast the week or two before SCRUB day; and then the clouds burn off and the sun comes out in full force that day. We take everything that is washable out of the classrooms and scrub. Cots are scrubbed first and then become drying racks for all of the toys and manipulatives. It is an exhausting day, and we drag ourselves home when we are...finally...finished. You are cordially invited to join us in the fun. FISH credits are given to any and all who join us.

It is "Summertime, and the livin' is easy" for the children. The teachers, however, are busy—even before SCRUB week. They are

busy creating a relaxed, "easy"-yet-stimulating environment for our children. The 2011 summer session began on June 20 with a week of Vacation Bible School. This is always a great week! As we planned our summer activities, we thought this year's VBS theme sounded so fun we decided to use it all summer. Summer 2011 at Bethany Lutheran Preschool is nine weeks of Big Jungle Adventure with Jesus.

Our summer days begin in the classrooms with Jesus time and morning snack. At 9:20 Explore and Discover time begins, and continues throughout the morning. The teachers choose a post—some indoors and some outdoors—and facilitate activities that they have prepared for the children. The children are free to choose the activity that appeals to them. They can stay with one activity for the whole morning, or they can go between the various activities going on that day. The teachers' plans include games, music and movement, science experiments, math games, flannel board stories, puppet play, art (lots of messy art), finger plays, dramatic play, and Jesus-centered activities. Before it gets too hot, we might also take a few walking field trips. We might walk to Pan American Park, and maybe to a store or two. On some hot days, the wading pools and water tables will come out, and the children will play in the water!

In addition to keeping the summer fun, relaxed and easy, the teachers will be busy planning their curricula for next fall. They will plan their monthly themes for the year, and prepare their parent handbooks. Some will paint their classrooms, and make other changes they feel are needed. They will find the time to fit in a few well-earned vacation days. It takes a lot of work for teachers to keep Preschool "livin'easy"!!!
